#### **Performance Notes:**

### Measure-Specific

- M1-2 (and every subsequent imitation of this) The arrival point (emphasis) of the phrase is on the 4-note chord
- M61 This ossia is included in the case that your personal physical limitations do not allow you to cross to the upper octave. To aid in getting the cross successfully, move your right hand mallets to the outer edge of the bars (on the other side of the node, closest to you)
- M157 The right hand A/Bb would be easiest to play with the Bb in the inner mallet and the A in the outer mallet. The "+" means the notes should be dead-stroked (no rebound)
- M165 The caesura should be long enough for the listener to catch a breath, but should *not* give the illusion of a false ending

#### General

Mallet choice is up to the performer – either uniform or graduated sets are acceptable Notes in parentheses should be ghosted

Tenuto markings indicate weight and a slight emphasis in volume (about ½ of an accent) Crescendos/Diminuendos with no ending dynamic are meant to imply phrasing within the current dynamic level

- Written stickings are suggestion only. They have been left out in many places due to the large variety of sticking possibilities
- For this piece, dynamics only apply to the staff above them. Dynamics in the middle of a system only apply to the top staff, and dynamics below the system only apply to the bottom staff. This does not apply when the music is beamed across both staves (e.g. m134) in which case the bottom dynamic applies to both staves
- For this piece, all two-handed rolls should be played hand-to-hand as a default, but you may switch to ripple rolls during swells or other phrasing-appropriate moments as desired
